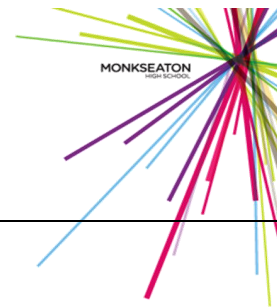

This board has examples of revision tasks that you could set at home. You could change the topic and reset the task to get maximum use out of each task and add variety to your child's revision.

<p>Create 20 flash cards about the case studies in Human Geography topics.</p>	<p>Assemble a list of key terms for one Physical Geography topic (either Hazards, Coasts and Rivers or Ecosystems). Connect these key terms with how they link to each other.</p>	<p>Create 20 flash cards with case studies from Physical Geography units</p>
<p>Complete one 9 mark question from a specimen paper on AQA website</p>	<p>Change your notes on Hazards topic into a mind-map</p>	<p><i>Using your Physical Geography notes draw diagrams to show key landform formation</i></p>
<p>Search for a relevant Geography news story and annotate it with connections to any of the key topics, applying your knowledge to real life</p>	<p>Arrange a presentation on your fieldwork. Reduce some of your presentation into hand outs for your audience.</p>	<p>Using your class book, retry a question that you feel you could improve. Complete this and ask for it to be marked.</p>
<p>Test yourself on Geographical skills using questions at back of revision book</p>	<p>Make river and coast landforms out of playdough</p>	<p><i>Practice questions using sources ie maps, tables and photographs</i></p>
<p>Practice a issue evaluation question from Paper 3 and ask for it to be marked.</p>	<p>Revise 5 facts from each case study and get someone to test you on them.</p>	<p>Find and annotate photos from one topic to act as a memory aid</p>
