You must: either take photographs of things relating to your project or use existing photoshoots or images of your work and manipulate them using the double exposure setting to create a series of 6 or more new images.

You could: refine your outcomes by making links to an artists work you have studied through colour schemes, techniques they have used or compositions they often use in their work. (At least 6 outcomes)

CHALLENGE: As well as the above, create a poster design which is advertising a product or event by using text in your images to compliment your design! Give it the wow factor!

A *Duplicate Layer* is a non-destructive way of working on the image.





Background Copy is unlocked.

Adjustments can now be made to the *Background Copy* layer.






The *Compare* symbol.


Brightness, Contrast, Tint, Curves etc. can all be changed at this stage. Try a few different settings before you commit.

Adjust as necessary. Use the sliders to fine-tune. Then click *Apply*.

You can compare the original to the current image by clicking on the *Compare* symbol.






The *History* box shows applications already applied.




In *Adjustments* you will find the *CURVES* tool. Experiment with this and see what happens to the image.

Each of the colour levels shown in the *CURVE* tool can be adjusted to suit. Some changes may not be obvious. Compare the images on the right. What's different?







The *Filter* option increases creativity by adding FX. Try experimenting on your image to see what each effect does.




The *EFFECT LIBRARY* has categories of filters that can be added to your image. Click on a category and try a few filters to see what happens.




All filters are adjustable.

achieve unique effects.




The image on the next

ATONIC filter.




Overlaying Filters.



The *KAREN* filter overlaid with the *ATONIC* filter.





The *LIQUIFY* tool is very versatile. Artistic effects can be achieved relatively easily. Direction, size, strength and density can all be adjusted.







Some controls or tools may never be used. However, the *ZOOM* tools can be useful for detailed work such as when using the brush to draw or *LIQUIFY* to distort. (See example on the right.)

Adding an *ELEMENT*




ELEMENT OVERLAY is useful for adding light effects to photos. They work in much the same way as filters. *OVERLAYS* can be layered, rotated and/or flipped.









A border can add interesting effects to the image. Like overlays, they can be layered until the desired effect is reached. There are a few border groups that are free – again, do not click on the *PREMIUM* categories.




Examples from the *INK* group of *BORDERS*.



Examples from the *BRUSHED* group of *BORDERS*.







Adding Images.

Adding, layering or superimposing images to make a *composite* can be very useful when editing.


PIXLR has an AI function in its PREMIUM package which can remove backgrounds easily. However, the BASIC version of PIXLR relies on removing the background manually.

Open the background image. Go to **LAYER** then **ADD IMAGE AS LAYER**. Choose your foreground image from your files. Click **OPEN**.





The foreground image (the person) will be superimposed on the first layer (the bridge). There are a few ways to remove the unwanted areas around the person. This will need to be done manually. As stated, only *PIXLR PREMIUM* has the intelligent (*AI*) function. However, doing it manually is good practise as you get to know what the various tools are capable of.




REMOVAL tools that you're likely to use are:



- Eraser
- Lasso
- Magic Wand

The *ERASER* rubs-out the pixels and can be controlled by adjusting the sliders.

The *MAGIC WAND* selects areas in the same colour range. Hold down the *SHIFT* key and click to select multiple areas. Click *EDIT* then *CUT* to remove.

The *LASSO* tool (*FREEHAND*) is useful for selecting large areas. Click *EDIT* then *CUT* to remove.







To fine-tune the image you need to use the **ERASER**.

When drawing around the person, remember that it's the background that is being removed. Notice where the dotted line is in the above image. **POLYGON LASSO:** Choose a starting point and click. Work your way around the person (or object) by clicking at various points. Then **EDIT/CUT**. It can only outline in straight lines, so, after removing the background, you will need to fine-tune the image.




The larger the image, the better. To do this, click **VIEW** then **ZOOM IN**. There are pre-sets for 100/200/300% if you prefer. Click **FIT SCREEN** to return to normal view.



The *ERASER* tool can be adjusted by moving the sliders. The type of brush can be selected from the menu. It's best to use a variety of brush styles when removing unwanted areas – a fine eraser brush allows detailed work.



If you want to add a *FILTER* to unify your photo, go to *LAYER* then *MERGE DOWN*. Instead of two distinct layers, you now have one.



To add a *FILTER* or *EFFECT* repeat instructions given earlier in the booklet. When you are happy with the result, go to *FILE/SAVE*. Save in your documents as a *PNG*.




- The app is free to download from the Apple App Store or from Google Play.




PIXLR HOME PAGE









The *Magic Wand* tool is great for adding effects and filters to your photo. There is a menu above the toolbox: *Effect/Overlay/Stylize*.

Effect lets you chose the type of filter for your photo.

Overlay lets you add elements like bokeh, lens flare, scratches and dust etc.


Stylize lets you chose an effect such as *Posterise*, *Silk* and *Watercolour*.



Once you have chosen your filter, click on the **TICK** at the bottom of the screen.




Draw Tool

Remove parts of the filter by using the *Eraser*. The original photo will appear.







DEFAULT OVERLAYS are useful for adding effects to photos. They can be layered on top of each other to give spectacular effects. The transparency of each overlay can be altered by a slider.



Do not click on overlays highlighted with a yellow crown symbol. These are **PREMIUM** features.


