2	When Christians want to know how God wants them to live, where is an obvious place for them to look? Many of the teachings and stories have messages for Christians to think about and discuss with others. But it is not always that straightforward? Why do you think this is? (especially in the New Testament?) What is the Golden Rule? What does it mean? This idea of treating others as you want to be treated is highlighted in the story of The Good Samaritan.
